# WETIWETI WENEREI HĀKINAKINA






This month we continued our Wetiweti Wenerei with Social Netball at Te Kura Kaupapa Māori o Kawakawa Mai Tawhiti.

## WHAKAMANAHIA RANGATAHI PROGRAMME





Our Weekly Rangatahi-Led program continued this month, offering a safe space for rangatahi to explore their goals, aspirations and passion. The program covers essential life skills, including home economics, all while providing support and guidance. This month they enjoyed social sport, some attended the First Aid course this month, and 4 attended the overnight Maui Whakahī trip to Kinloch for trout fishing.

There are 17 rangatahi who have signed up so far, and we're excited to see the program grow and make a positive impact on our rangatahi.

## WHAKAMANAHIA RANGATAHI HOLIDAY PROGRAMME





Our Taiohi rōpu also had an awesome day planed at Paerauta Marae for their Whakamanahia Holiday Programme this month.

Putting their cooking skills to use while preparing our kaitahi which included a Banana Loaf, and Chicken/vege fettuccine, with garlic bread.

A big mihi to Kaneihana Dewes for taking our hītori kōrero focusing on our marae and tipuna. While also delivering interactive activities such as games, skits and Kahoot to test their knowledge.

They also done an Amazing Race which included a range of activities from blind taste testing, Matakāoa knowledge, weetbix challenge, apple bobbing, riddles and more.

#### **PIKI TE ORA**



Significant mahi has been happening behind the scenes for our Remote Patient Monitoring (RPM) program. Te Whatu Ora team have progress on Piki Te Ora, this is awesome news! Enhancing this program will have a huge impact on whānau health and wellbeing. Let's keep pushing forward! These improvements will enable us to soon start onboard more whanau, enabling more whanau to monitor their health from home.

Program Benefits: Reducing Hospitalizations: Piki Te Ora to date has shown it helps in reducing hospital visits and improves health outcomes for whānau with long-term conditions. - Enabling Better Care and Support: The program equips whānau with tools to manage their health concerns, track vital signs, symptoms, and medication usage, enabling early intervention and informed decision-making. - Supporting Recovery: Piki Te Ora and our Kaimanaaki supports whānau with long-term conditions or post-hospital discharge care, helping them take control of their health and wellbeing.

This program is especially crucial for our rural communities, where access to healthcare services can be limited. With hospital hours away and emergency services potentially delayed, RPM can help bridge the gap and provide whānau with the support they need to manage their health. We're excited on how far RPM program has come and being able to bring more whānau onboard and make a positive impact on our community's health.
