## **Covid Updates:**

Manaaki Matakāoa is continuing to support the community from Covid-19 by regularly doing testing in the community, with around 534 tests taken in May, we were able to identify and care for 9 positive cases this month. As a community, we are all doing a great job at keeping the covid numbers low but with national rates still averaging over 1500 cases a day, many hospitalisations and roads opening back up, there is still potential for covid outbreaks.

Kia kaha, kia mataara tonu. Masks, vaccinations and isolating well are still our best weapons against covid and for our pakeke and high health-risk whānau there is covid antiviral medication.
